 - feeling down or anxious?
 - not coping at school?
 - not sleeping well or sleeping too much?
 - bullied, hurt or sexually harassed?
 - having relationship issues?

Perhaps it's time to reach out and relax. The Intereach ROAR service supports you and your family if you are showing early signs of, or are at risk of developing a mental health issue.

► Where is it available?

ROAR works with children and young people aged up to 18 years in the local government areas of Balranald, Wentworth, Berrigan, Hay, Edward River, Murray River, Federation, Murrumbidgee, Narrandera, Wagga Wagga, Lockhart, Leeton, Temora, Griffith, Carrathool, Coolamon, Cootamundra-Gundagai and Junee. If you live outside of this area, phone us and we can find the right support for you.

► Is there a cost?

ROAR is completely free and confidential.
