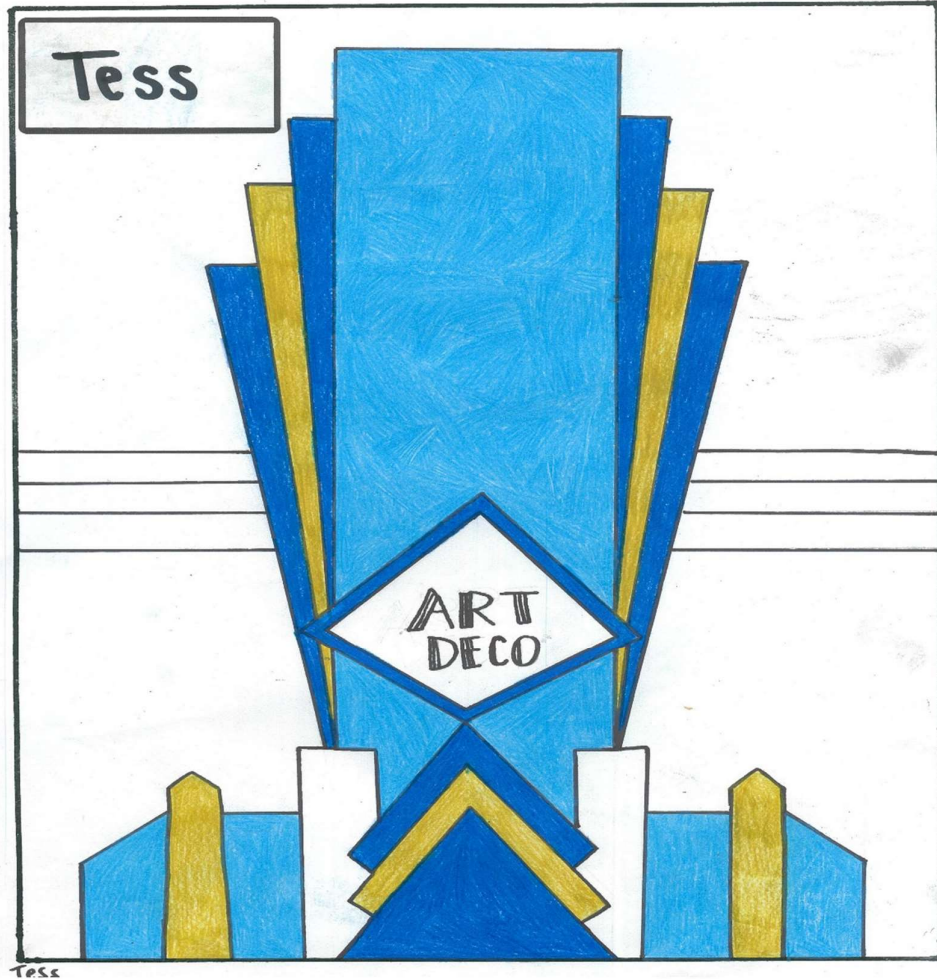

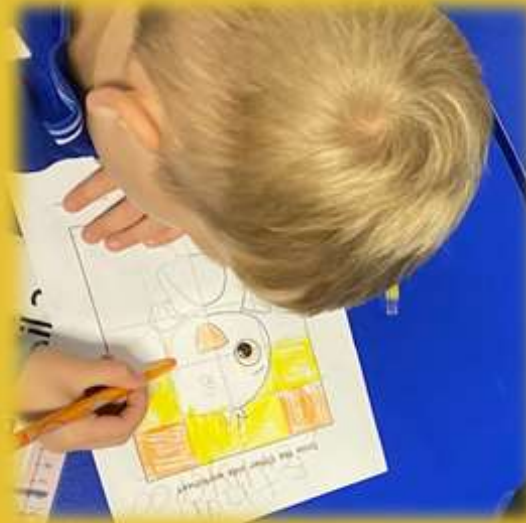

Please encourage your child to read as many nights as possible to improve their knowledge and comprehension. Reading can be logged on the Kluwell reading app.





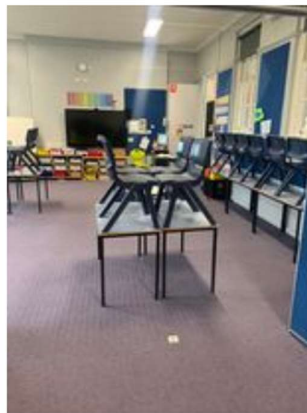
# HIGHLIGHTS FROM TERM 2
