### **PDHPE**

As part of the PDHPE curriculum students at Yanco Public School has been lucky to have to opportunity to participate in a number of different learning activities. Last term students were given lessons through the Little Athletics Association and AFL. This term they will be participating in Gymnastics lessons, facilitated by **Little Champions** and partly funded through the **Sporting Schools Grant.** 

Healthy Harold and the **Life Education Team** will be visiting our school on Friday this week and students will be provided with the opportunity to learn Life Saving skills through the **St John Ambulance Little First Aiders Program** in November.

Students in year K-4 will be participating in a program which focuses on strengthening social, emotional resilience. This program has been developed for students to develop explicit skills and strategies related to social emotional development, building and maintaining friendships and leadership skills. Game activities will be provided for the students to practice things like turn-taking, listening, sportsmanship, following instructions and friendship skills whilst strengthening basic social and emotional life skills in other areas.

The program will be facilitated by **Brigette Pritchett** from **The Salvation Army** and students will be participating with their teacher and class. Activities will be held on Thursdays for 6 weeks starting in Week 3.

In each of these activities, there will be some occasions where students may be photographed, and we will follow all school policies and parental permissions in relation to this.
