

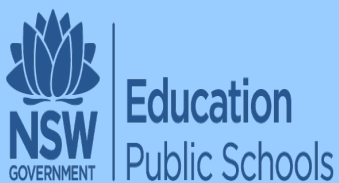

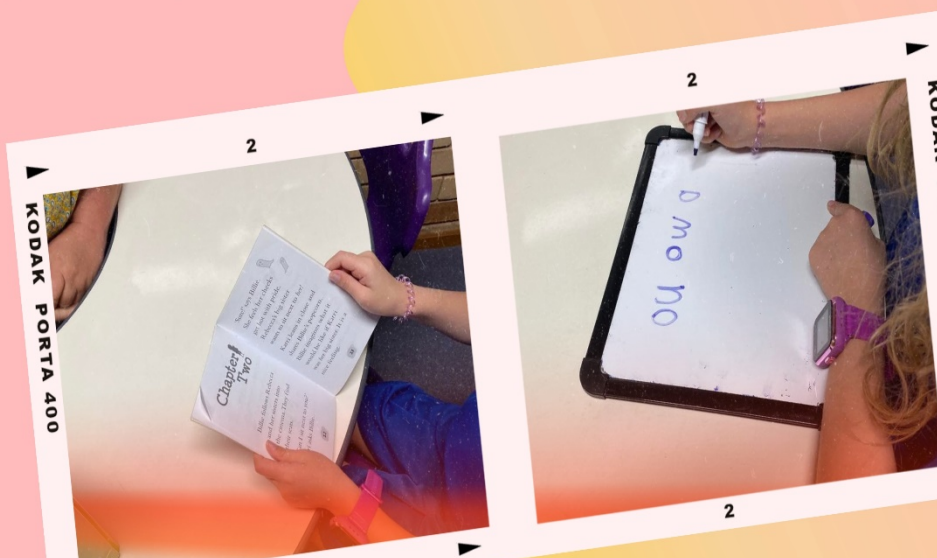

Sunsmart Snippet

Don't forget your eyes.
Sunglasses don't have to be expensive to be effective.



Considerations when choosing sunglasses for best protection:

- Choose sunglasses that meet the Australian Standard AS/NZS 1067.1:2016 with a lens category of 2, 3 or 4.
- Some sunglasses are marked with an Eye Protection Factor (EPF). An EPF of 9 or 10 provides excellent protection.
- Wrap around, close fitting and large lenses help to reduce reflected UV radiation and glare that can pass around the edge of sunglasses.


